
Joanne Horton

Joanne Horton was born and raised in Los Angeles, California. She studied Ceramics at Otis College of Art and Design under Ralph Bacerra and graduated in 1994 with a BFA in Ceramics. Since graduating, she has worked creating custom tile murals for private homes and restaurants, and has been teaching Ceramics for the past seven years. Currently, she owns and operates Creative Fire, a ceramic art studio, with her partner, Rich Mudge (BFA, Ceramics, 1993- Otis College of Art and Design).

Joanne Horton's work deals with the issues of feminine sexuality, Hollywood and fashion industry ideals of beauty, and the lengths that women will go to attain them. Advances in medical technology have combined with the long standing obsession with good looks and youth in American culture to create a general atmosphere of "If you don't like what you see in the mirror, call a doctor, if you're feeling down, take a pill". Clay is the ideal medium to express these concepts, because of its similarity to the human condition. It is soft and pliable in the beginning, becoming hard and rigid through processing. It is never completely predictable, sometimes experiencing unexpected changes. Clay can also be molded to look like almost any other material, yet still retains its own properties.
